shall be in secret. And your Father who sees in secret shall Himself reward you openly. 5 "And when you pray, you shall not be like the hypocrites. For they love to pray standing in the congregations and on the corners of the streets, to be seen by men. Truly, I say to you, they have their reward. 6 "But you, when you pray, go into your room, and having shut your door, pray to your

Father who is in the secret place. And your Father who sees in secret shall reward you openly.

As well with my friend Nehemiah and Keith beginning their tour in South Africa this week teaching the Prayer of our Father, again this week's Torah study is spot on teaching us about how to pray to our Father. If you have not read the book or listened to their teaching on this I urge you to do so.
