

I have been asked many times about living in Israel. I have the following letter from those who live there and how it is possible for each of us to go. Look and see where you qualify and no matter what go and visit the land soon.

I know that many are wondering how it is legally possible to stay in Israel if they aren't Jewish.

If someone cannot make citizenship based on their Jewish Lineage/religion, according to the Law of Return, then there are some other options.

Once we've acquired the farm, we can apply for 5 year foreign worker visas. This would be based on agriculture. If we have experts in a field that isn't available here, a specialty, then we can also apply for work visas. Now these visas are very rare and hard to get but with YHWH anything can be accomplished. We can also apply for volunteer visas. The important thing is that we show the bureaucratic system that we are bringing people here to benefit Israel, rather than take away jobs, and that we are doing things legally. We need to have people fill roles here that aren't being filled.

For those who long to be here but can only afford to support themselves short term, they can possibly consider applying for the following visas:

Student visas

Journalist

visas Work

visas etc

Here are some of the ways we know of, that people have been allowed to stay in the land: 1.residency based on relatives on Yad Vshem wall of Righteous Gentiles (if your family members helped Jews during the Holocaust, you might be allowed residency) 2. Residency based on unique businesses, especially favored are export businesses

3. Residency based on children living in the land (illegally) for more than 5 years, and are in public schools and fluent in Hebrew (not encouraging anyone to live here illegally)
4. We know of a non Jewish family given residency because the father was an engineer who helped develop something in Israel
5. Residency to a bible scholar, based on their ability to teach at the University

We also know of some who travel internationally a lot. They come in and out of the country, renewing their 3 month tourist visas continually. However this is becoming more and more difficult and likely not a good idea to stay in Israel long term on this status.

We know of many doing full conversions to Judaism. Yes you have to deny Yeshua in an orthodox conversion.

We know of some who live in Jordan and visit Israel often but again, this is becoming frowned on, and there are no guarantees you will be allowed to cross back over the border into Israel.

We have heard of some volunteering for the IDF/army, but have not learned how to do this yet. This is likely something very difficult to do as we know someone who tried unsuccessfully to do this.

We know of people coming here out of desperation, and staying as Asylum Seekers or Refugees under the International Asylum Seeker law (must be able to prove your life was in danger due to civil war, etc)

So as you can see, there are a lot of people here in the land legally, and He will make a way if it's His will for someone to be here.

Some things to keep in mind is that Israel is expensive. You have to be independent in all ways and especially financially. You have to be prepared for battle. Israel is not for the weak and whiney. Cry-babies stay home! If you are offended by such a statement, stay home. Israel isn't a country known for being polite. Merciful and generous yes, polite, no. If you think you can come here to teach someone something, stay home. Israel will change you, challenge you, humble you, strengthen you, stretch you, and teach you. You might need to come for awhile, return to where you came from, regroup, refresh, and jump back in again. Seasons in and seasons out are not uncommon. Don't come with any expectations. Yes there are giants in the land but your God is bigger , and this is HIS land.

Some of the good things about living in Israel are that this land comes closest to any other nation, of walking in God's will. It is the only nation that takes national holidays off for the Holy Days in the torah. It is the only place you can find the torah woven into its laws, culture, schools, government. The very rocks cry out that the Bible is true, with every archaeological and historical proof, screaming God's fingerprint is HERE! Eating kosher is effortless here. This is the most fought over piece of real estate in history! To be here is a privilege to say the least.

Its worth fighting for. Its worth working for. Its worth sacrificing for.

I was also shown this video of how the local farmers are being harassed off the land by the arabs. Listen to the what this young soldier has to say and think of what we could do. Pray about this. Pray and Fast about this. Myself and some others will be fasting this weekend.
